



SEC yield is a calculation based on a 30-day period and is computed by dividing the net investment income per share earned during the period by the maximum offering price per share on the last day of the reporting period.

Credit Quality letter ratings are provided by Standard and Poor's, Moody's, and Fitch and are presented as the higher of the three ratings. When a security is not rated by Standard & Poor's, Moody's, or Fitch, the highest credit ratings from DBRS and Kroll may be used. Absent a rating from these agencies, we may display Private Credit ratings, if permitted by the issuer, which could include ratings from Egan-Jones Ratings Co. Credit ratings reflect the credit quality of the underlying issues in the portfolio and not the portfolio itself. Credit rating exposure and composition are subject to change.

Issues with credit ratings of BBB or better are considered to be investment grade, with adequate capacity to meet financial commitments. Issues with credit ratings below BBB are considered speculative in nature and are vulnerable to the possibility of issuer failure or business interruption.

The top 10% of products in each product category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars, and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. The Overall Morningstar Rating for a managed product is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five-, and 10-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating metrics. The weights are: 100% three-year rating for 36-59 months of total returns, 60% five-year rating/40% three-year rating for 60-119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% five-year rating/20% three-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns. While the 10-year overall star rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10-year period, the most recent three-year period actually has the greatest impact because it is included in all three rating periods.

The BBH Income Fund was rated against the following number of Intermediate Core-Plus Bond category funds over the following time periods: 554 funds in the last three years and 526 funds in the last five years. With respect to these Intermediate Core-Plus category funds, the BBH Income Fund (Class I), received an Overall Morningstar Rating of 5 stars. Class I three and five-year periods received ratings of 5 stars and 5 stars, respectively.
